Dear Comisión de Cultura del Congreso de los Diputados:

I am disappointed to learn that you are considering new steps to protect bullfighting as what is being called a cultural pastime.

Bullfighting is an archaic form of entertainment. It is a violent, bloody spectacle – a throwback to a time when people took no heed of of the feelings of animals and the bull was an object of torment for boys who wanted to impress their fellows.

Bullfighting has had a long history in Spain, but times and sensibilities have now changed. Today, we see clearly that it is not fair to pit a skilled, practised, sword-wielding matador against an unwilling, confused, maimed, psychologically tormented and physically debilitated animal.

Tormenting and butchering bulls for entertainment belongs in the Dark Ages – not in 21st century Spain. I urge you to reject the initiative to protect bullfighting as a cultural activity. Cruelty is not part of our culture.
